## CAPAC: 50 years of Canadian Music

The Composers, Authors and Publishers Association of Canada is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year.

Funny things, anniversaries. You never quite know whether people regard 50 as an age when maturity starts to slow you down, or one when experience suddenly starts to mean something.

CAPAC hasn't spent much time worrying about it. Instead, we've been getting on with our main job, which is to collect performing rights royalties from organizations using music, and distributing the money to the people who compose and publish it.

Mind you, there's more to CAPAC than that. In addition to representing its own 3500 members, it also administers the works of nearly 250,000 foreign composers and publishers when their music is performed in this country.

In addition, CAPAC provides grants to assist young composers, publishes *The Canadian Composer* 10 times each year, runs the annual Sir Ernest MacMillan lectures, and acts as a resource centre for composers of all kinds.

If you'd like to know more about CAPAC's role on the Canadian music scene, just ask.



#### THE WARSAW MUSIC WORKSHOP

The Warsaw Music Workshop was founded in Warsaw in 1963 and originally gave contemporary music concerts in co-operation with the Experimental Studio of the Polish Radio. At that time it had no regular members but engaged performers according to the repertoire. Since 1967, it became a permanent group consisting of four musicians playing the trombone, cello, piano and clarinet. The ensemble specializes in presenting works by contemporary composers with whom a very close and permanent contact has been established. In addition, at the request of the leader Zygmunt Krauze, a lot of Polish and foreign composers have written works especially for the group. The repertoire consists of instrumental and theatrical compositions as well as works requiring electronics.

The Warsaw Music Workshop has performed at the Warsaw Autumn Music Festival, in the Nordic countries, throughout Europe, and in Yugoslavia and Czechoslovakia. This spring marks their first tour of North America.

#### ABOUT THE PERFORMERS

ZYGMUNT KRAUZE (piano), leader of the group, was born in 1939 and graduated from the Warsaw Conservatory in both piano and composition. He then continued his studies in Paris and in 1966 was awarded the First Prize at the International Competition for the Performers of Contemporary Music in Utrecht. He has given solo recitals throughout Europe.

EDWARD BOROWIAK (trombone), born in 1934, studied Musicology at the Warsaw University and trombone at the Warsaw Conservatory.

WITOLD GAŁAZKA (cello), born in 1941, graduated with distinction from the Warsaw Conservatory in 1966. He is a permanent member of the Polish Radio and T.V. Orchestra.

CZESŁAW PAŁKOWSKI (clarinet), born in 1934, studied Musicology at the Warsaw University and clarinet at the Warsaw Conservatory.

#### PROGRAMME NOTES

IMPROVISATIONS SONORISTIQUES - - - - - WITOLD SZALONEK

Born in Czechowice in 1927, Szalonek studied composition with Wojtowicz at the State Advanced School of Music in Katowice. Since 1966 he has been teaching at this school as a Professor of Composition. During 1970 he was a guest lecturer in composition at the Aarhus Conservatoire in Denmark.

Improvisations sonoristiques is an aleatoric piece written especially for the Warsaw Music Workshop. The title of this work already suggests the problems the composer is trying to solve - the widening of the sound range of European instruments through their preparation and the use of new sound articulation. These new sonoristic qualities shape the micro and macro-structures of the work.

#### POUR QUATRE - - - - - - - WLODZIMIERZ KOTONSKI

Kotonski was born in Warsaw in 1925 and studied composition with Rytel and Szeligowski. Since 1957 he has been working in the field of new music and co-operating closely with the Experimental Studio at the Polish Radio. He is currently teaching tape-recorded music at the Warsaw State Advanced School of Music.

Pour quatre, written especially for the Warsaw Music Workshop, has as its main feature a free, chamber-like style of playing. There is no score for the work, only four separate parts in which instructions are given as to how the work is to be played.

#### SWINGING MUSIC - - - - - - - - KAZIMIERZ SEROCKI

Born in Torun in 1922, Serocki studied composition with Sikorski in Poland and in Paris with Boulanger. Since 1956 he has been one of the organizers of the international contemporary music festival "The Warsaw Autumn".

Swinging Music was commissioned by and dedicated to the Warsaw Music Workshop. The composer combines jazz rhythms with new unconventional ways of producing sounds. This gives surprising sonoristic effects while maintaining the swinging character of the music.

#### KRABOGAPA - - - - - - - - - ANDRZEJ DOBROWOLSKI

Dobrowolski was born in Lwów in 1921 and studied organ, voice and clarinet at the Warsaw Advanced School of Music. After the war, he continued his studies in theory and composition at the Cracow State Conservatoire. He is currently a lecturer in theory and composition at the Warsaw State Advanced School of Music.

Krabogapa was written for the Warsaw Music Workshop and the title "Krabogapa" is made up of the first syllables of the names of the ensembles' instruments. The form of the work is based on a three-fold concentric symmetry which consists of sections of great density of short shounds as well as long quiet planes displaying all sorts of vibrato.

## POLYCHROMIE - - - - - - - - ZYGMUNT KRAUZE

Born in Warsaw in 1938, Krauze studied composition with Sikorski and piano with Wilkomirska in Warsaw. He then completed his studies with Nadia Boulanger in Paris. He was one of the founders and is currently the leader of the Warsaw Music Workshop.

Polychromie was written for the ensemble in 1968. The main feature of this work is the lack of contrasts in the music. Groups of sounds, as uniform as possible, are separated by gaps of silence and form a piece which is meant to have no beginning and no end. The number of length of the groups of sound and gaps of silence are left to the performers' judgement, although the composer has set the limits to this choice.

## KWARTET 2 + 2 - - - - - - - BOGUSLAW SCHÄFFER

Schäffer was born in Lwów in 1929 and studied composition in Cracow with Malawski. Since 1963 he has been a teacher of composition at the State Advanced School of Music in Cracow. He has also written numerous books on modern music.

Kwartet 2+2 was written for two pianos and two optional instruments. The piece is written in the form of four independant graphic scores which suggest the music by means of various signs and drawings. These are meant to stimulate the performers to produce individual sounds, textures, complexes and structures.

## IDYLL - - - - - - - - - - ZYGMUNT KRAUZE

Written for forty folk instruments and tape, the instruments include four hurdy-gurdies, four bag-pipes, four folk violins, sixteen bells, eight pipes and four fifes. Written in 1974, the work was commissioned by Westdeutscher Rundfunk Köln(West Germany). It is partly a theatrical piece in that the performers walk in and around the hall while playing. All the instruments were made especially for the ensemble by polish folk artists. The tape contains recordings taken from the sounds of nature such as domestic animals, birds, wind, water, etc.


