## PROGRAMME NOTES

BRUCE MATHER ------ Madrigal IV

Born in Toronto in 1939, Mather studied composition in Paris with
Darius Milhaud and Olivier Messiaen, and earned degrees in music from
Stanford University and the University of Toronto. Also a well-known
pianist, he performs regularly on the Société de Musique Contemporaine
du Québec concert series, and is part of the renowned duo-piano team Le Page & Mather. Since 1966 he has taught composition at McGill
University.

Part of a series of five madrigals inspired by poems of the late Canadian poet Saint-Denys Garneau, "Madrigal IV" was commissioned by the Lyric Arts Trio. The text is based exclusively on one sentence from Garneau's poetry: "Et mon regard part en chasse effrenement de cette splendeur qui s'en va, qui s'echappe par les fissures du temps". A short text, few words, a breath, in the spirit of an epigrammatic Japanese poem, Mather's music serves as a subtle ink drawing aroung the poem. The tape part consists of recorded flutes and soprano only, which at the beginning forms simply a back-drop for the live performers, and later a coordinated quartet (i.e. 2 sopranos and 2 flutes) and finally a canon in which the performers play the same music as the tape but somewhat delayed.

"Cage d'oiseau", for soprano and piano, is a setting, also by the poet Saint-Denys Garneau. The sense of Garneau's verses may be rendered as follows: "I am a bird-cage; a bird-cage of bones, in which Death makes his nest." The image is carried skillfully and gently throughout the poem without a touch of the grotesque, concluding with the idea that when Death has eaten all, he will end with "my soul in his beak."

GILLES TREMBLAY ---- "...le sifflement des vents porteurs de l'amour.."

Born in Arvida, Quebec in 1932, Tremblay studied composition in Paris with Olivier Messiaen, Yvonne Loriod, and Maurice Martenot - the inventor of the ondes Martenot - becoming the first Canadian specialist on that instrument. While still a student, he met Edgar Varese in New York, which had a significant and lasting influence on his music. Currently a professor at the Conservatoire de Musique de la Province de Québec in Montreal, the enticing music of this composer has been widely performed and acclaimed in France and Canada.

The composer writes: "The title, "...the whistling of the winds - bearers of love..." is a quotation from the Spiritual Canticle XIV by St. John of the Cross. The theme of this is wind, physically and spiritually (pneuma, spiritus). Its presence forms the music - breath, through the pureness of silence: frozen states, plays and possibilities ("...bearers of love..."). In addition to this verse, fascinating idea of the "First moment of the Resurrection".

MICHEL GONNEVILLE ------ Trois Poemes d'Alain Fournier
Born in Montreal in 1959, and presently a student of Gilles Tremblay,
Gonneville will receive his composition diploma this spring from the
Conservatoire de Musique de Montreal. He has spent several summers
studying composition in Darmstadt and Paris, and plans to return to
Europe for further study next year.

About his work he writes: "For me, as a young composer, "Les Trois Poemes" was another way of chasing craftmanship ghosts out of my mind. I composed the first parts freely, the second parts in a more strictly organized manner, the second influencing the first, and the piece then correcting itself as it progressed. The poems, those of a friend, speak of frost, the contemplation of an autumn's April (on regard seulement alors qu'il faudrait sortir), and a sharing of what is "yours, mine, ours - like the waves liberate themselves and become the sea again". What remains is what I call an intimate, needle-engraved work of high-pitched sounds."

CLAUDE VIVIER -----Lettura di Dante Of himself, Vivier writes: "Born in Montreal in 1948. Born to music with Gilles Tremblay in 1968. Born to composition with Stockhausen in 1972.

Of his music he writes: "Seen a strange star, t'was written: I am a melody in six cells but my whole has seven parts. I have a voice you don't see, a presence you don't hear. And a strange vessel took of my tea table, I opened my eyes, a smiling Signore Danct stood in front of me with a nice gift. T'was Lettura di Dante. That was the plus one! And still, still a childish sadness hearing gone voices..."
