Subscribe early to be sure of *reserved seating* for all six exciting concerts.



Canada's Sydney Hodkinson has written and will direct three new works on the fourth concert. The final programme in the series will include a repeat of New Music Concerts' first season success, "Ancient Voices of Children", with the composer George Crumb present and assisting in a concert of four of his most recent works.
