

This first version of this work was presented in December 1985 in Montreal at the Société de Musique Contemporaine du Québec. This new updated version includes now a soprano singer

and a more elaborated video set up. A MIDI "Videotizer" has been invented to control the switching of the 32 video monitors with any kind of MIDI live instruments or composition software.

# **ALAIN THIBAULT**

ALAIN THIBAULT, computer music composer and multimedia director, was born in Quebec City in 1956. In 1982 he received top honors in the electroacoustic category of a Radio-Canada competition for young composers. In 1986 he won the Sound Page competition held by the American magazine, Keyboard, for his piece for Fairlight synthesizer God's Greatest Gift. His works have been performed in Canada, the United States, France and Japan. He has been teaching electroacoustic music technique at the University of Montreal since 1984.

# MIGUEL RAYMOND

MIGUEL RAYMOND was born in Montreal in 1960. He has been working as an independent video director

for seven years. In 1983 he received top honors for the Media Byte Video Canadian Competition. He had a video installation at the Quebec's Museum of Contemporary Art during the international event "Video 1984" Montreal. He was an invited artist at the Graphic Institute of Technology of Tokyo directed by Ko Nakajima. His works have been presented in Canada. United States, Japan and Europe.

# JEAN VINCENT FOURNIER

JEAN VINCENT FOURNIER was born in Montreal in 1960. He has been close follower of the music and movie scenes for the last ten years or so, both as a songwriter and film technician. He has collaborated with the likes of Louis Malle, William Friedkin, Ted Kotcheff and Michel Lemieux.

## Pauline Vaillancourt

Soprano PAULINE VAILLANCOURT a specialist in contemporary and avant-garde repertory. Her name is linked with first performances of many works by Canadian composers, among them Serge Garant, Gilles Tremblay, Claude Vivier and many others. In addition to her activity in concerts and on radio and television, she performed many operatic roles in repertory by such diverse composers as: Mozart, Bizet, Puccini, Poulenc, Berg. Stockhausen, Aperghis and Kagel. She now makes her home in Paris and appears in concert in many European cities.

# Robert M. Leroux

ROBERT LEROUX is currently full time percussion teacher and vice-dean at the Faculty of Music of the University of Montreal. He is also a member and a soloist of the Société de Musique Contemporaine du Québec. He has performed with the Montreal Symphony Orchestra, the Orchestre Métropolitain, the Orchestre de Radio Canada and the National Art Centre Orchestra. He freelances as a percussionist.

## René Masino

RENÉ MASINO won first prize in bassoon from the Conservatory of Music of Montreal and was a member of the Montreal Symphony Orchestra for fifteen years. He currently teaches at the Faculty of Music of the University of Montreal where he is also the director of interpretation and jazz programs. He free-lances as bassoonist and saxophonist and plays with the Montreal Saxophone Quartet.

LUX, the source of knowledge, fire of the Prometheus myth, awakens from the chaos of a mineral world and then is robbed by an unknown human-animal creature. This provokes the creature to split into two parts. It then begins constructing a fantastic machine, symbolic vision of his rational evolution in which he will find himself trapped. The meaning of LUX can be understood in various ways, including the political implications of nuclear light as a positive power as well as a threat for mankind.

Visually, the work makes use of multiple slide material with timing and coordination controlled by a computer. The images are projected into a three-dimensional stage set made up of a

variety of white, geometrically shaped modules which could be combined into myriad of shapes. Two mimes, themselves clothed in geometric costumes, form a part of the overall configurations. The great size, resolution of detail and depth of colour of LUX's projected images combined with its mobile set, create a luxurious and constantly modulating space.

The sound has to fill the hall: thereby, everything appears larger than life and renders the gestures, costumes and images oversized, on a scale almost equal to that of the amplified sounds. The sounds themselves are orchestral in the range of coloristic effects, sustained clusters of pitches, bursts of noise, cascades of frequency modulated bell-like sounds, synthetic voices, etc... The

music is conceived so as to create a sensual, visceral atmosphere in a technological context with atomic clock precision.

The overall integration of audio and visual components creates kaleidoscopic world-like sequences of geometric patterns combined with a Romantic sensibility and results in a fused space.

# RENÉE BOURASSA

As multi-media, multi-image concept artist and audiovisual producer, RENÉE BOURASSA has directed her research to investigating a new kind of language, integrating audio with visual forms. In the early 1980's, she explored the artistic possibilities of computer-programmed multiimages projected onto moving three-dimensional objects. After having worked on the visual concept of Une autre création du monde Passange, she founded and directed the multi-media project LUX, a synthesis of her preceding research.

# MARCELLE DESCHÊNES

MARCELLE DESCHÊNES is professor of composition and director of the Electroacoustic Composition

Program at the University of Montreal. As a multi-media composer, she began in 1980 to produce pieces integrating electroacoustic or computer music, synthetic voices and body sound art, visual forms. performing arts and a multidimensional sound space. After having founded and directed different works as OPERAaaaAH, JOUR "J", deUS irae (Silver Award at the 1986 AMI International Multi-Image Competition), she collaborated on the creation of different multi-media shows produced with visual artists: Ecran Humain (P. St-Jean), LUX (R. Bourassa, J. Collin) and Big Bang II (G. Dyens). She now creates a new kind of spectacle, a technological opera merging voices, circus, electronic and performing arts: WE.

# JACQUES COLLIN

As a photographer. technician, producer, and multi-images artist, JACQUES COLLIN collaborated on the production of several multimedia works produced Quebec. such as OPERAaaaAH (M. Deschênes). E.L.V.I.S. (A. Thibault), Ecran Humain (P. St-Jean, M. Deschênes). deUS irae (M. Deschênes. Silver Award 86 AMI). Solid Salad (M. Lemieux) and LUX (R. Bourassa, M. Deschênes). With these works, he produced the major part of the photography, processing and editing as well as the multiimages programming.

## André Fortin

ANDRÉ FORTIN has acquired a mime formation at the Montreal Corporeal Mime School. He then became a teacher in the same school

and active member of the Mime Troup Omnibus, with which he worked for 6 years (Beau Monde, Alice, Casse-tête, Europe and Asia Tours).


