## ENCOUNTERS '94

The Encounters series offers a rare opportunity to come face to face with some of the great creative artists of our time. Cultures, countries and composers interconnect. Share in the adventure of these encounters, and meet many of the composers as they illuminate their musical worlds on stage and during intermission features.

Encounters '94 leads off with music by the illustrious Polish composer Henryk Gorecki, whose spell-binding Symphony of Sorrowful Songs has captured gold on the international charts. In a programme inspired by spirituality and mysticism, also featured are works by one of Canada's greatest composers, Gilles Tremblay, and Melissa Hui, a rising young star.

On April 27, Encounters presents music by two outstanding composers of Chinese heritage. Bright Sheng survived China's cultural revolution and has become one of America's most sought-after composers. Chan Ka Nin is a Canadian born in Hong Kong and a nominee for a Juno in 1994.

Featured on May 11 is music by two young men who have created waves internationally. Mark-Anthony Turnage of England gained notoriety with his sensational Three Screaming Popes. Canadian Chris Paul Harman became a star by taking top honours at the International Rostrum of Composers in Paris - the first Canadian ever to do so.

The last concert highlights two of the greatest voices in the lyric theatre today. Harry Somers' operas Louis Riel and Mario and the Magician are landmarks in Canadian music theatre. William Bolcom's McTeague made international headlines at its recent Chicago Lyric Opera premiere. No encounter with Bolcom would ever be complete without an appearance by America's beloved duo, Bolcom and Morris.
