The Wit of Jürg Wyttenbach

"Beethoven: the Avant-garde composer"

For Immediate Release – Toronto, April 2, 2009: Despite his very successful and high profile career in Europe, the playful and iconic Swiss composer, conductor and pianist Jürg Wyttenbach is not so well known in North America. To address this anomaly, New Music Concerts has invited Mr. Wyttenbach for a week-long residency in Toronto. On Saturday, April 18 at Glenn Gould Studio, NMC presents The Wit of Jürg Wyttenbach, a concert devoted primarily to Wyttenbach's music in which he will conduct the New Music Concerts Ensemble and also perform as pianist. As a composer, his works are often humorous and theatrical in nature as will be seen in the program he has devised for NMC in which a number of Beethoven's settings of folksongs are interspersed with his own unique impressions of folk idioms. By doing so, Wyttenbach points a new direction for New Music Concerts. "I use musical and scenic means in an attempt at showing existential problems", explains the composer. Xin Wang, Melinda Delorme and Kathleen Promane — all emerging artists who have already distinguished themselves on the concert and opera stage - are the three young talented singers who will perform this musical feat. Finally, a performance of Wyttenbach's orchestration of Mussorgsky's Children's Songs for voice and 16 instruments will bring this novel evening to a close.

On Monday, April 20 at 7pm, Wyttenbach's visit will culminate with a piano recital/lecture "Beethoven: the Avant-garde composer" at Gallery 345 (located at 345 Sorauren Avenue). It features Wyttenbach's performance of Beethoven's piano Sonatas opp.90 and 109; Beethoven's Sketches for op.109 and Wyttenbach's own Trio to the "Prestissimo" and Six "new" Variations on the third movement of that sonata designed to complement and expand on Beethoven's ideas. This intimate evening is designed as a benefit performance on behalf of New Music Concerts. The \$50 admission includes a wine and cheese reception. A charitable tax receipt will be issued for a portion of the ticket price as per Canada Revenue Agency guidelines.

Born in 1935 in Berne, Jürg Wyttenbach studied in Berne and Paris. He lives in Basel, where he teaches contemporary music and piano at the Music Academy. He directs the Ensemble der Internationalen Gesellschaft für Neue Musik (IGNM) Basel and, with Heinz Holliger and Rudolf Kelterborn, organizes the Basel Music Forum symphony concerts. As conductor and pianist, he has performed well over 100 works by 20th century composers, both famous and lesser known, including many creations and first performances. "Jürg Wyttenbach is one of the most respected musicians today; New Music Concerts is proud to welcome him to Toronto for the first time", comments NMC's artistic director Robert Aitken.
