





















Message from the Artistic Director

The number of significant composers who lived in Vienna around the end of the 18th century has always amazed me – Gluck, Mozart, Salieri, the Haydns, Beethoven, Diabelli, Clementi, Hummel and Schubert to name a few. But equally surprising is how many important composers were born in the years 1912 and 1913. Was there some sort of wave of musical creativity that flowed through the universe at that juncture? Each of these composers created their own unique style and in some cases individual methods of composing. Even the influences are difficult to trace as if the originality came from a deeper source.

For some time now, members of our audience have been alerting us to these centennials as well as a number of significant 80th birthdays. As all of these composers hold a cherished place in our memories, we are honouring six centenarians in a special fundraising 100th Anniversary Concert where we plan to reminisce and display some of the many photos in our archives. Three 80 year old composers will be performed on two of our series concerts and as has been our habit in recent years, we continue to celebrate the seemingly eternal creativity of Elliott Carter with a work written in his 103rd year.

But of course the season is not all about venerable age. We have four young composers from across Canada in Generation 2012 and new works from Brian Harman, Adam Scime and So Jeong Ahn. There are also international guests and new works from Korea and Germany. As you look through our brochure, designed by Daniel Foley with archival pictures by André Leduc, search out the composers' birth years, marvel at the breadth of creativity and join us for this festive season.

As always, we would like to thank the composers, performers, audience members, arts councils and foundations who continue to show their support.
